

Players receive \$9,000 Trillium grant

The Greely Players will receive \$9,700 from the Ontario Trillium Foundation.

Funds will be used to purchase a storage trailer, racks and other neces-

sities for the costume room, and risers, among other things. The funding announcement was made in June.

The Players' final report on the funding is due in Oct. 2010, with ac-

counting records to show how the money was spent. The executive has the ability to re-allocate up to \$1,000 (10 per cent) to other areas within the grant.

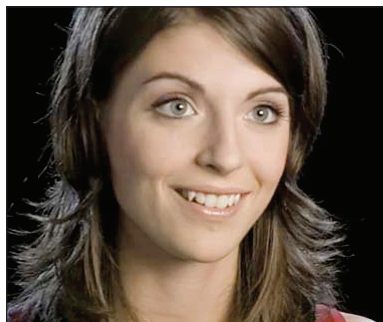


Austin LaMarche (left) received a \$1,000 bursary from Greely Players' president Sophie Hall on Tues., Aug. 11.
